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## **INTRODUCTION**

This report outlines programs and funding sources of grant and grant-in-aid funds available for distribution for FY 2003 (July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2003) by the Arizona Criminal Justice Commission (ACJC). The report also denotes a number of successes experienced by participating agencies during the previous year.

The ACJC administers several U.S. Department of Justice grants including the Edward Byrne Memorial State and Local Law Enforcement Block Grant (Byrne), Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT), National Criminal History Improvement (NCHIP), Criminal Justice Records Improvement (CJRIP), Local Law Enforcement Block Grants (LLEBG), Victim of Crime Act (VOCA), and Radio Interoperability and Records Integration Analysis (Byrne Discretionary). The state Legislature has also appropriated funds for projects that help the criminal justice community with funding for projects such as Gang Violence Prosecution; Victim Assistance and Compensation; Aggravated Domestic Violence Offender Prosecution; Prosecution of persons who Sexually Exploit Children; and Cold Case Crime Lab Processing. These grant funds are passed through the ACJC to county and municipal agencies.

Grant and grant-in-aid funds include the following cash or in-kind matching funds: 10 percent for Local Law Enforcement Block Grants (LLEBG) and National Criminal History Improvement Program (NCHIP); 25 percent for Edward Byrne Formula Grants (Byrne), Criminal Justice Records Improvement Program (CJRIP), and Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT); and 400 percent for Sexual Exploitation of Children Prosecution.

The ACJC awards the majority of grants starting with the State fiscal year (July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003). However, variations in some federal funding streams do not allow for consistency. LLEBG are awarded on a calendar year (January 1, 2003 to December 31, 2003) and NCHIP grants start when funding becomes available.

## **GRANT AND AID PROGRAMS**

### **Aggravated Domestic Violence Prosecution**

These funds are appropriated yearly by the state Legislature for distribution to County Attorneys as pass-through grants for the purpose of prosecuting aggravated domestic violence cases.

### **Aid to County Attorneys**

Arizona Revised Statute § 41-2421, commonly referred to as "Fill the Gap", distributes monies collected within the State Aid Fund to enhance criminal case processing. These funds, along with appropriations made by the state Legislature, are passed through to counties based on a composite formula that consists of the three year average felony filings in Arizona Superior Court branches.

### **Aid to Indigent Defense**

Arizona Revised Statute § 41-2421, commonly referred to as "Fill the Gap", distributes monies collected within the State Aid Fund to enhance criminal case processing. These funds, along with appropriations made by the state Legislature, are passed through to counties based on a composite formula that consists of the three year average felony filings in Arizona Superior Court branches.

### **Crime Victim Assistance (Victim Assistance)**

These grant funds are statutorily mandated fees paid by parolees. Grant funds are used to assist local government agencies and private non-profit agencies with operating expenses related to their victim assistance programs.

### **Crime Victim Compensation (Victim Compensation)**

The source of this state funded grant program is a set percentage (4.6%) from the Criminal Justice Enhancement Fund (CJEF) pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-2401. Grant funds are used to offer compensation to victims and survivors of victims of criminal violence, based on rules established by the Commission. Grant funds are awarded to County Crime Victim Compensation boards that distribute the funds to eligible crime victims.

### **Criminal Justice Records Improvement Program (CJRIP)**

Federal law requires that a minimum of five percent of the Edward Byrne Memorial State and Local Law Enforcement Assistance Formula Grant funds received by the state must be expended to improve criminal justice records. The grant funds are used to develop communication infrastructures that will lead to a fully integrated criminal justice information system.

**Edward Byrne Memorial State and Local Law Enforcement Assistance Formula Grant (Byrne Apprehension, Byrne Prosecution, Byrne Detention, Byrne Forensic, Byrne Adjudication)**

This federal formula grant program provides each state with funds to support 28 authorized purpose areas specified in the federal legislation. The federal funds, leveraged with mandatory fines collected for felony drug offense convictions authorized by A.R.S. 13 Chapter 34, and match funds furnished by the grantee make up the Drug and Gang Enforcement Account established by A.R.S. § 41-2402. Generally, funds may be used to improve the criminal justice system by providing additional personnel, equipment, facilities, and training to help apprehend, prosecute, and adjudicate persons who violate state and local laws relating to the production, possession, and transfer of controlled substances.

**Edward Byrne Discretionary Grant Program (Radio Interoperability and Records Integration Analysis)**

These federal grant funds are used to conduct a statewide analysis of public safety radio interoperability and to build communication systems that will support both verbal and data communication throughout the state. In addition, funds are used to conduct a cost analysis for criminal justice records integration by the Commission as part of a needs assessment.

**Full Service Forensic Crime Laboratory Grant Program (Crime Laboratory)**

The program source of these grant funds are court filing fees, penalties, and surcharges. These funds are used to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the state's various crime laboratories.

**Gang Prosecution**

The funds for this program are appropriated yearly by the state Legislature for distribution to the Arizona Attorney General's Office and to Arizona's County Attorneys as pass-through grants to enhance efforts in the prosecution of criminal street gang related cases.

**Local Law Enforcement Block Grants (LLEBG)**

These federal block grants provide funds to units of local government for the purposes of reducing crime and improving public safety. The grants may be used for one or more of seven program purpose areas specified in the federal legislation.

**National Criminal History Improvement Program (NCHIP)**

This federal grant program is used to enhance the quality and completeness of the nation's criminal history record systems and can be used to support a wide range of ongoing technology efforts.

**Obscenity Prosecution**

These funds are appropriated yearly by the state Legislature for distribution to County Attorneys as pass-through grants to improve the detection and prosecution of violators of laws relating to obscenity in Title 13, Chapter 35 of the Arizona Revised Statutes.

**Residential Substance Abuse Treatment for State Prisoners (RSAT)**

These federal grant funds are used to implement residential substance abuse programs that provide individual and group treatment activities for offenders in residential facilities operated by state and local correctional agencies. These programs must fulfill the following requirements: last between six and twelve months; be provided in residential treatment facilities set apart from the general correctional population; focus on the substance abuse problem of the inmate; and develop the inmate's cognitive, behavioral, social, vocational, and other skills to solve the substance abuse problem.

**Sexual Exploitation of Children Investigation/Prosecution (Child Sexual Exploitation)**

The funds for this program are appropriated by the state Legislature for distribution to one law enforcement agency and one County Attorney as pass-through grants to improve the detection and prosecution of offenses involving violations of A.R.S. § 13-3508, 3552 and 3554 Sexual Exploitation of Children.

**Victim of Crime Acts (VOCA)**

These federal grant funds are used to offer compensation to victims and survivors of victims of criminal violence, including terrorism, drunk driving, and domestic violence. Funds are used for expenses attributable to physical injury resulting from a compensable crime.


**Program Highlights**

*Byrne Apprehension Program administered by the Apache County Sheriff's Office*

The Apache County ACCENT Task Force made 129 drug related arrests in FY 2002, 71 percent of which were use/possession arrests. This continues to reflect the task force's firm user accountability approach to deterring drug abuse in Apache County. The task force seized 173 pounds of marijuana, 32 marijuana plants under cultivation, 689 grams of methamphetamine and 135 dosage units of other drugs. This enforcement program provides limited coverage for an area suspected of having high levels of transportation of illicit drugs coming from the U.S. - Mexico border, through southern Arizona and New Mexico, and on to other states.

*Crime Victim Compensation administered by the Apache County Attorney's Office*

The Apache County Crime Victim Compensation Board approved payments totaling \$52,803. Of the total, the Board approved \$48,172 for funeral costs and \$4,631 for medical expenses.

*Byrne Apprehension Program administered by the Cochise County Sheriff's Office*

The Cochise County Border Alliance (BAG) Task Force made 225 drug related arrests in FY 2002, seizing 669 ounces of cocaine, 18,930 pounds of marijuana, 54 marijuana plants under cultivation, and 682 grams of methamphetamine

The Cochise County Crime Victim Compensation Board approved payments totaling \$86,941. Of the total, the Board approved \$11,733 for funeral costs, \$35,919 for medical expenses, and \$12,444 for mental health counseling.

### Program Highlights

#### *Byrne Apprehension Program administered by the Flagstaff Police Department*

The METRO Task Force is administered by the Flagstaff Police Department. Participants include the Northern Arizona University Police, Arizona Department of Public Safety, Williams Police Department, Federal Bureau of Investigation, U.S. Custom Service, the Coconino County Sheriff's Office, Coconino County Attorney's Office, and the Flagstaff Police Department. This multi-agency task force has made 215 arrests in FY 2002. The task force has seized over 160 ounces of cocaine, 33 pounds of marijuana, 93 cannabis plants under cultivation, 536 grams of methamphetamine, and 329 dosage units of dangerous drugs. The unit has also seized drug law violators' assets with an estimated value of \$122,475.

#### *Crime Victim Compensation administered by the Coconino County Attorney's Office*

The Coconino County Crime Victim Compensation Board approved payments totaling \$78,957. Of the total, the Board approved \$28,883 for funeral costs, \$28,929 for medical expenses, and \$16,212 for mental health counseling.

**Program Highlights**

*Byrne Apprehension Program administered by the Gila County Sheriff's Office*

The Gila County Narcotics Task Force arrested 240 drug law violators in FY 2002, of which 32.91 percent were charged with sales/trafficking offenses. The unit has seized 5 ounces of cocaine, 1,432 pounds of marijuana, 152 cannabis plants under cultivation, and 314 grams of methamphetamine, with smaller amounts of other dangerous drugs. Drug violator assets seized have an estimated gross value of \$216,508.

*Crime Victim Compensation administered by the Gila County Attorney's Office*

The Gila County Crime Victim Compensation Board approved payments totaling \$43,625. Of the total, the Board approved \$23,607 for funeral costs, \$8,692 for medical expenses, and \$2,129 for mental health counseling

### Program Highlights

#### *Byrne Apprehension Program administered by the Graham County Sheriff's Office*

The Southeastern Arizona Drug, Gang and Violent Crime Task Force made 64 drug law violator arrests in FY 2002; of these, 42 percent were for use/possession offenses. The unit has seized 203 grams of methamphetamines.

#### *Crime Victim Compensation administered by the Graham County Attorney's Office*

The Graham County Crime Victim Compensation Board approved payments totaling \$16,455; of these, the Board approved \$8,750 for funeral costs and \$6,491 for medical expenses.



**Program Highlights**

*Byrne Apprehension Program administered by the Yuma Police Department*

The Southwest Border Alliance Narcotics Task Force (BAG) arrested 507 drug law violators in FY 2002. Of these, 77.51 percent were for sales/trafficking offenses. The task force has maintained significant levels of productivity. Illicit drug seizures include over 125,221 grams of cocaine, 19,960 pounds of marijuana, over 239 grams of heroin, 6,322 grams of methamphetamine, and 5,060 dosage units of other dangerous drugs. These statistics continue to show the severity of an enormous drug trafficking problem along the border between the United States and the Republic of Mexico.

The Yuma County Crime Victim Compensation Board approved payments totaling \$110,496. Of the total, the Board approved \$21,588 for funeral costs, \$31,815 for medical expenses, and \$47,930 for mental health counseling.

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
