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INTRODUCTION

This report outlines programs and funding sources of grant and grant-in-aid funds available for distribution for FY 2002 (July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002) by the Arizona Criminal Justice Commission (ACJC). The report also denotes a number of successes experienced by participating agencies during the previous year.

The ACJC administers several U.S. Department of Justice grants including the Edward Byrne Memorial State and Local Law Enforcement Block Grant (Byrne); Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT); National Criminal History Improvement (NCHIP); Criminal Justice Records Improvement (CJRIP); National Incidence Based Reporting System (NIBRS); Local Law Enforcement Block Grants (LLEBG); Victim of Crime Act (VOCA); and Integrated Criminal Justice Information. The State Legislature has also appropriated funds for projects that help the criminal justice community with funding for projects such as Gang Violence Prosecution; Victim Assistance and Compensation; Aggravated Domestic Violence Offender Prosecution; Prosecution of persons who Sexually Exploit Children; and Cold Case Crime Lab Processing. These grant funds are passed through the ACJC to County and Municipal agencies.

Grant and grant-in-aid funds may include cash or in-kind matching funds: 10 percent for Local Law Enforcement Block Grants (LLEBG) and National Criminal History Improvement Program (NCHIP); 25 percent for Edward Byrne Formula Grants (Byrne), Criminal Justice Records Improvement Program (CJRIP), and Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT); and 400 percent for Sexual Exploitation of Children Prosecution.

The ACJC awards the majority of grants starting with the State fiscal year (July 1, 2001 to June 30, 2002). However, variations in some Federal funding streams do not allow for consistency: LLEBG are awarded on a calendar year (January 1, 2002 to December 31, 2002); CJRIP grants August 1, 2001 to July 31, 2002; NCHIP, NIBRS and Integrated Criminal Justice Information grants starts when funding becomes available.

GRANT AND GRANT-IN-AID PROGRAMS

Aggravated Domestic Violence Prosecution

These funds are appropriated yearly by the State Legislature for distribution to County Attorneys as pass-through grant for the purpose of prosecuting aggravated domestic violence cases.

Aid to County Attorneys

Arizona Revised Statute § 41-2421, commonly referred to as “Fill the Gap”, directs that monies collected within the State Aid Fund to enhance criminal case processing. These funds are passed through to Counties based on a composite formula based on a three year average felony filings in Arizona Superior Court branches.

Aid to Indigent Defense

Arizona Revised Statute § 41-2421, commonly referred to as “Fill the Gap”, directs that monies collected within the State Aid Fund to enhance criminal case processing. These funds are passed through to Counties based on a composite formula based on a three year average felony filings in Arizona Superior Court branches.

Crime Victim Assistance (Victim Assistance)

The program source for these grant funds are statutorily mandated fees paid by parolees from prison. Grant funds are used to assist local government agencies and private no-profit agencies with operating expenses related to their victim assistance programs.

Crime Victim Compensation (Victim Compensation)

This state funded grant program source is a set percentage (4.6%) from the Criminal Justice Enhancement Fund (CJEF) A.R.S. § 41-2401 mandated by statute. Grant funds are used to offer compensation to victims and survivors of victims of criminal violence, based on rules established by the Commission. Grants funds are awarded to County crime victim compensation boards that distribute the funds to eligible crime victims.

Criminal Justice Records Improvement Program (CJRIP)

Federal law has required that a minimum of 5 percent of the Edward Byrne Memorial State and Local Law Enforcement Assistance Formula Grant funds received by the state should be expended to improve criminal justice records. The grant funds are used to develop communication infrastructures that will lead to a fully integrated criminal justice information system.

Edward Byrne Memorial State and Local Law Enforcement Assistance Formula Grant (Byrne Apprehension, Byrne Prosecution, Byrne Detention, Byrne Forensic, Byrne Adjudication)

This federal formula grant program provides each state with funds to be used to support 28 authorized purpose areas specified in the authorization legislation. Generally, funds may be used to provide additional personnel, equipment, facilities, personnel training and equipment for more widespread apprehension, prosecution and adjudication of

persons who violate State and local laws relating to the production, possession and transfer of controlled substances and to improve the criminal justice system.

Full Service Forensic Crime Laboratory Grant Program (Crime Laboratory)

The program source of these grant funds are court filing fees, penalties and surcharges. These funds are used to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the states various crime laboratories.

Gang Prosecution

The funds for this program is appropriated yearly by the State Legislature for distribution to the Attorney General's Office and Arizona's County Attorney's as pass-through grants to enhance efforts in the prosecution criminal street gang related cases.

Juvenile Jail Improvement (Juvenile Jail Study)

These funds were a special appropriation made by the Legislature for the purpose of conducting feasibility and construction studies and the remodeling or constructing county jail facilities for juvenile remands being tried as adults.

Local Law Enforcement Block Grants (LLEBG)

The federal block grants provide funds to units of local government for the purposes of reducing crime and improving public safety. The grants may be used for one or more of 7 program purpose areas specified in the authorization legislation.

National Criminal History Improvement Program (NCHIP)

This federal grant program is used to enhance the quality and completeness of the nation's criminal history record systems and can be used to support a wide range of ongoing technology efforts.

National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS)

National Incident Based Reporting System awards are made to states applying on behalf of one or more cities or counties in the state. This federal grant program allows state and local jurisdictions to capture detailed offense, offender, victim property and arrest information that goes beyond aggregate statistics and raw counts.

Obscenity Prosecution

These funds are appropriated yearly by the State Legislature for distribution to County Attorneys as pass-through grant to improve the detection and prosecution of violators of laws relating to obscenity in Title 13, Chapter 35 of the Arizona Revised Statutes.

Residential Substance Abuse Treatment for State Prisoners (RSAT)

These federal grant funds are used to implement residential substance abuse programs that provide individual and group treatment activities for offenders in residential facilities operated by state and local correctional agencies. These programs must: last between 6 and 12 months; be provided in residential treatment facilities set apart from the general correctional population; focus on the substance abuse problem of the inmate; and develop the inmate's cognitive, behavioral, social, vocational, and other skills to solve the substance abuse and related problems.

Sexual Exploitation of Children Investigation/Prosecution (Child Sexual Exploit)

The funds for this program are appropriated by the State Legislature for distribution to one law enforcement agency and one County Attorney as pass-through grant to improve the detection and prosecution of offenses involving violations of A.R.S. § 13-3508, 3552 and 3554 Sexual Exploitation of Children.

State Information Technology Integration Implementation Program (Integrated Justice Information)

This federal grant program is designated to support states' efforts to connect information networks that will allow police officers, court administrators, corrections officers, and other officials at the Federal, state and local levels to share relevant justice information.

Victim of Crime Acts Compensation (VOCA)

These federal grant funds are used to offer compensation to victims and survivors of victims of criminal violence, including terrorism, drunk driving and domestic violence. Funds are used of expenses attributable to physical injury resulting from a compensable crime



Program Highlights

Byrne Apprehension Program administered by the Apache County Sheriff's Office

The Apache County ACCENT Task Force made 104 drug arrests in FY 2001. 58 percent of these were use/possession arrests. This continues to reflect the task force's firm user accountability approach to deterring drug abuse in Apache County. The task force seized 292 pounds of marijuana; 21 cannabis plants under cultivation; 620 grams of methamphetamine; and 504 dosage units of other dangerous drugs. This enforcement program provides limited coverage for an area suspected of having high levels of transportation of illicit drugs coming from the U.S. - Mexico border, through Southern Arizona and New Mexico, and on to other states.

Program Highlights

Byrne Apprehension Program administered by the Cochise County Sheriff's Office

The Cochise County Border Alliance (BAG) task force, operates along the 83 miles of remote, sparsely populated United States border with the Republic of Mexico, and has continued its high levels of productivity in drug seizures, including over 12,103 ounces of cocaine; 54,494 pounds of marijuana; 20 cannabis plants under cultivation; over 2,246 grams of methamphetamine; and moderate amounts of other dangerous drugs. The task force made 284 arrests; 52.8 percent were for sales/trafficking offenses in FY 2001. This level of task force activity continues to support the value derived from inter-agency cooperation in the anti-drug campaign, with substantial impact on reducing the availability of illicit drugs.

Byrne Apprehension Program administered by the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office

The Western Maricopa County Narcotics/Gang Task Force made 141 drug related arrests in FY 2001; of these 73 percent were for sales/trafficking offenses. They also seized 75 ounces of cocaine; 1,723 pounds of marijuana; and 181 grams of methamphetamine. This unit also made 27 non drug related gang arrests for the 12 month period ending June 2001.

Byrne Apprehension Program administered by the Phoenix Police Department

The Commercial Narcotics Interdiction Unit is strategically located and has continued to maintain high levels of productivity. In FY 2001 it seized over 2,019 ounces of cocaine; 6,787 pounds of marijuana; 65 grams of heroin; over 3,052 grams of methamphetamine; and 8,697 dosage units of other drugs. Of the unit's total of 189 arrests; 167 (88.35 percent) were for sales/trafficking offenses. The unit has had a significant impact on drug trafficking use of commercial transportation in Arizona.

Byrne Apprehension Program administered by the Yuma Police Department

The Southwest Border Alliance Narcotics Task Force (BAG) has arrested 467 drug law violators in FY 2001. Of these, 73.44 percent were for sales/trafficking offenses. The task force has maintained significant levels of productivity. Illicit drug seizures include over 2,679 pounds of cocaine; 28,819 pounds of marijuana; over 45,929 grams of heroin; 51,741 grams of methamphetamine; and 4,399 dosage units of other dangerous drugs. These statistics continue to show the severity of an enormous drug trafficking problem along the border between the United States and the Republic of Mexico.
